



DGM Message Title: No Exceptions, No Exclusions!

Topic: We have tremendous power through what we say

Message Summary: One of the ways we are made in God's image is as speaking spirits. God has given us tremendous power to do good or ill through what we say. Our words must be chosen wisely and cautiously, but with faith. We need to stop talking to God about our mountains and start talking to our mountains about God.

Key Points:

- "Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruit." Proverbs 18:21 (NKJV)
 - The greatest evil and the greatest good that can happen in a human life are in the power of the tongue.
 - Your tongue is your spiritual hands.
 - "There is freedom of speech, but I cannot guarantee freedom **after** speech." – Idi Amin
 - The quality of your life will be determined by the quality of your speech.
- "Now the next day, when they had come out from Bethany, He was hungry." Mark 11:12 (NKJV)
 - God has a very long history of meeting us wherever we are to **take** us where we need to go!
- "And seeing from afar a fig tree having leaves, He went to see if perhaps He would find something on it. When He came to it, He found nothing but leaves, for it was not the season for figs." Mark 11:13 (NKJV)
 - Jesus had every practical reason to expect something worthwhile on that tree.
 - Then fallen reality hit Him in the face.
- "In response Jesus said to it, 'Let no one eat fruit from you ever again.'" Mark 11:14 (NKJV)
 - In the spirit, our battles are waged by what we believe and what we say.
 - The battles in our lives first happen in our hearts.
 - What comes out of our mouths is proof of what's winning on the inside.

- “A good man out of the good treasure of his heart brings forth good; and an evil man out of the evil treasure of his heart brings forth evil. For out of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaks.” Luke 6:45 (NKJV)
 - “Sometimes I find myself not being honest with myself.” - BG
 - “In my prayer time, I start talking until I start telling the truth.” - BG
 - Whatever came out of Jesus’s mouth revealed God’s heart.
- “In response Jesus said to it, ‘Let no one eat fruit from you ever again.’ And His disciples heard it.” Mark 11:14 (NKJV)
 - If we’re going to learn from Jesus, we have to stop letting another person’s irresponsibility become our responsibility.
 - Instead of asking why others keep doing certain things to us, we should be asking ourselves why we keep **allowing** it.
 - We cannot change what we do not confront.
 - Truth only sounds like hate to those who hate truth.
- “Now in the morning, as they passed by, they saw the fig tree dried up from the roots.” Mark 11:20 (NKJV)
 - Just because your problem stays green for a little while, doesn’t mean what you’re saying is not having an impact below the surface.
 - God is far more concerned with getting to the root of our problem, than dealing with its berries.
 - Jesus didn’t have to see it to believe it.
- “And Peter, remembering, said to Him, ‘Rabbi, look! The fig tree which You cursed has withered away.’” Mark 11:21 (NKJV)
 - We tend to curse the wrong things.
 - Jesus never cursed people, only things.
 - Instead of saying, “Nothing ever works out for me;” say, “All things work together for my good.”
 - Bible verses to support:

 - It’s happening because you keep saying it!
 - If you go to the root of that thing, you may be able to reverse that thing.
 - “What I’m learning about God’s words is that they are laws.” - BG
 - These principles are laws.
 - When you realize certain things in God’s kingdom are a law, you stop wasting your time trying to believe.
 - You just trust the law.

- “So Jesus answered and said to them, ‘Have faith in God.’” Mark 11:22 (NKJV)
 - **It doesn’t take any faith to say what you see; it takes faith to say what you do not see.**
 - “For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, ‘The just shall live by faith.’” Romans 1:17 (NKJV)
 - **Sometimes you have to speak things that are not as though they were.**
 - **No exceptions and no exclusions!**
- “For assuredly, I say to you, whoever says to this mountain, ‘Be removed and be cast into the sea,’ and does not doubt in his heart, but believes that those things he says will be done, he will have whatever he says.” Mark 11: 23 (NKJV)
 - The mountains in your life are waiting to see what you have to say about them.
 - “Stop talking to God about your mountains and start talking to your mountains about God.” – Joel Osteen
 - Jesus has given us the authority to tell our mountains what to do and where to go.
 - “When I’m in trouble... I feed my faith until my doubts begin to starve.” - BG
 - As you get into God’s Word, at some point faith clicks, and you know that you know that you know.
 - “If you have to doubt something, doubt your limits.” – Price Pritchett
 - Nothing haunts us like things we don’t say.
 - Better to have one *oops*, than a thousand *what ifs*.
- Things to declare:
 - I am wonderfully and marvelously made.
 - My body believes what I say.
 - My body is my servant.
 - Healing begins from the root of the issue and continues to the fruit of the issue.
- How do you get to a place where you have no more doubts?
 - “The journey of a thousand miles begins with one step.” – Lao Tzu
 - My words are spiritual and when I begin to speak them...
 - I’m not God, but I’m made in the image of God.
 - What makes us like God is that we’re speaking spirits.
