



DGM Message Summary: You Anoint My Head

(11/8/15)

Message Summary:

Are you willing to be that one sheep out of all the sheep in the flock that God can pull away for Himself? Are you willing to dwell in the house of the Lord forever so you can stop living on the outside and start living on the inside?

Scriptural References:

- Psalms 23
 - The Lord is “my” shepherd (not just any shepherd, but our shepherd/king)
- Psalm 127:2
 - If your heart is secretly anxious, your efforts are in vain and of no benefit

Key Points:

- When God is at the center of your life, you are content and realize you have more than enough
- Our shepherd leads us to our blessings via slower streams so we can handle it; otherwise, it can quickly become a curse
- If God is working around the clock on our path, why are we staying up, too? (RE: Psalms 127:2)
- God can give you supernatural peace in the midst of the worst storm (RE: Psalm 23:3)
 - But this only happens when the Lord is indeed your shepherd
- Sheep tend to wander in circles, so they need a pasture (RE: Psalm 23:3)
 - If you’re stuck in a rut, God can break you out into a new path
- When you pray, set aside your righteousness and pray in His name
- Never build a house where God only wants you to pitch a tent (RE: Psalm 23:4)
 - Don’t give up in your valley; just keep walking
- Security doesn’t come from the environment, but from the shepherd because God is committed to getting you to the other side
- Even in the worst situation, the devil shrinks in comparison to the power of God
- To get to the overflow (verse 5), you have to go through the valley (verse 4)
- Goodness and mercy have a hit out on you (verse 6)

- If you're living under a dark cloud assuming something bad will happen, that's the devil!
